In the last few months there have been great changes at Susan's Farm. Rest assured we are still producing our delicious mutton, lamb, beef and geese.

Last May the farm became a **registered charity**; this has made it possible to access funds from charitable foundations. Our trustees are Fiona Merritt (chair), Julie Aglionby, Joe McGarry, Judy Morris and Lindsey Slater.

In July, we became accredited with the **Pasture for Life Association (PLFA)**. All our cattle and sheep are fed entirely on grass, on our own organic hay and haylage in the winter. This is much better for the planet and much healthier for us. Have a look at the PLFA website.

Susan's Farm is now the proud possessor of a **9-seater minibus** thanks to the G K Boyes Charitable Trust. Emma Hughes started as our part time Administrator in early February thanks to a grant from the Cumberland Building Society via Cumbria Community Foundation. 13 employees from the **Cumberland Building Society** head office spent two days in early March redecorating our education room and rebuilding a very dilapidated fence around the veg patch. We are extremely grateful to all those who have and are supporting the work of Susan's Farm whether it be financially or in kind.

With the **appointment of Emma**, working on Monday and Friday mornings, all day on Wednesday and flexibly at the weekend, the great migration of paperwork is taking place from Susan's kitchen table in the Croft to Susan's Mess, the farm office in our education building.
